


Urban Youth Employment in Sierra Leone

Headline findings from a survey carried out in April 2025 in Freetown, Bo and Makeni

The majority of respondents (75.2%) is self-employed without employees. The second largest group is paid employees (18.5%)

Employment status by gender

There is a clear gender disparity in emplyoment status: women are more likely to be self-employed than men



The majority of respondents work as traders/vendors and artisans/skilled manual labourers





84.2% of respondents do not pay contributions to the National Social Security and Insurance Trust (NASSIT)

How many hours per day do young people



The majority of respondents are satisfied with their working hours and pace of their work

Those participants who work as paid employees tend to see their work environment as more safe than self-employed respondents Overall the environmental conditions in my work are safe and acceptable
